

**Fauntleroy Community Association**  
**Minutes**  
**June 14, 2011**

The meeting was called to order by President Bruce Butterfield at 7:05pm. In attendance were board members, David Haggerty, Gordon Wiehler, Gary Dawson, Kim Petram, Mike Dey, Susan Lantz-Dey, Carolyn Duncan, and Kathleen Dellplain. Also in attendance were Mark Solomon, from the Seattle Police, Ed Pottharst, from the Dept of Neighborhoods, Irene Stewart from the Department of Senior Services, and Patrick Sand from West Seattle Blog.

The fundraiser for the Fall Festival was very successful. \$900.00 was raised from the baskets, \$1200.00 was contributed from the profit at Endolyne Joe's.

Irene Stewart gave a presentation on Senior Playgrounds. Senior Playgrounds are parks with equipment for adult exercise. Parks with adult exercise equipment are popular in Asia and Europe. She showed examples of equipment and people enjoying it. Since there are many Senior Citizens in West Seattle, it may be a good area for an exercise park. The 2003 Transportation Study needs to be updated. Kathleen Dellplain and Gordon Wiehler have agreed to work on this.
